Sixty-five years ago in 1957, nothing existed in terms of community based services for people with disabilities. Families had two options, they could keep their children at home with little to no support or the compassionate advice at that time was to place a child in an institution - hours away.

Quality Assurances Accreditation is a three-year accreditation term intended for organizations that are looking to implement responsive, person-centered supports and services. It involves numerous planning meetings, the validation of a Basic Assurances® Self-Assessment, review visits, focus groups, the use of Personal Outcome Measures® interviews, as well as ongoing support and consultation from CQL staff. With insight gained from the initial review visit and additional check-ins, EPI is developing and implementing action steps to continuously improve its services.

ABLE accounts are tax-free savings accounts for people with disabilities and their families.

COMPENSATION

We remain committed to offering fair and competitive wages and benefits for our employees. While revenue availability always has some uncertainty to it, this fundamental commitment remains our priority.

Annually we conduct an extensive comprehensive wage review to see how our positions compare in our markets. We are happy to share, EPI's Board of Directors approved market-based pay increases for many positions.

More specifically, for our direct support staff, both current and new hire pay grades have increased by \$2.00 per hour. The \$2.00 will be added to your base rate - \$16.50 - \$19.00. Night attendant (sleep) pay will increase to \$9.50 per hour.

ACT NOW, GET BOOSTED. BY

In summer of 2022, the CDC recommended a second booster dose for adults ages 50 and older. So far, only about 12.4 million Americans have received a second booster dose - making millions of people more vulnerable to the new Omicron strains.

Data suggests these strains, BA.4 and BA.5, have been on the rise for weeks and are associated with hospitalization rates and once again death rates.

The good news is with a second booster, you can restore your vaccine protection against hospitalization and death from COVID-19.

Act now to protect yourself and others around you.

- Talk to your doctor to find out if you are eligible to receive a booster.
- Monitor your local community levels and the levels of communities you may be traveling to.

 Follow CDC's testing and isolation guidelines if you are exposed or have symptoms.

General Community Guidance Still Applies:

- Continue to wash your hands frequently.
- Maintain improved ventilation. Avoid large crowds.
- Continue to follow CDC guidelines.

Following the CDC, we ask that you continue to:

- Monitor your symptoms before arriving to an EPI office or home of a person served. Stay home if you are ill or showing any symptoms.
- Seek testing when needed (tests are readily available consult with your healthcare professional or visit Testlowa.com for an at-home kit
- Remain strong in your efforts of taking general precautions such as avoiding crowds, washing your hands/don't touch your face, heighten cleaning routines.

Building quality environments one block at a time

THE LEADING INDICATOR OF QUALITY CHILD CARE BY MARY JANSSEN

lowa Quality for Kids (IQ4K) is lowa's new Quality Rating and Improvement System (QRIS) for DHS licensed Child Care Centers and preschools, registered Child Development Homes and programs operating under the authority of an accredited school district or nonpublic school.

IQ4K provides five levels of quality (building blocks) that programs can achieve and continue to improve on. By implementing Continuous Quality Improvement (CQI), IQ4K allows programs to assess their current grade across all areas of programming and devise a structured plan to increase the overall level of program quality.

Why should programs participate?

- Better overall level of program quality. Get structured guidelines to directly implement into programs.
 These include nutrition plans, staff development opportunities, educational plans, goals for kids, and much more.
- Bonus payments and reimbursement rates. Programs will receive a bonus payment upon achievement of each IQ4K level. Bonuses can be used for any area of the business. The higher

IQ4K level your program achieves, the higher your Child Care Assistance (CCA) reimbursement rate may be. Several grants and other funding opportunities require a program to have a QRIS rating.

- Specialized tracks for accredited programs. Suppose a program is already meeting enhanced standards through alternative DHS-approved entities (i.e., NAEYC Accreditation, NAFCC Accreditation, Head Start Performance Standards, Iowa Quality Preschool Performance Standards). In that case, IQ4K® will provide specialized tracks to avoid work that has already been completed.
- Less Paperwork! IQ4K has a brand-new electronic database that will drastically reduce paperwork requirements.
